The Terrace Community Foundation is delighted to announce the first recipients of grant funds to be awarded by the growing organization. In early May the Foundation began to solicit applications from local non-profit organizations for its first grant cycle. After four years of waiting for interest to build on the endowment fund, which has been set up to create an on-going source of revenue for grants, this first cycle is a significant milestone.

The Foundation congratulates the *Terrace Salmonoid Enhancement Society, Kimmunity Angels, Terrace Peaks Gymnastics Club, Helping Hands* and *Terrace Downtown Improvement Area* for their successful application to receive grant funds for their initiatives. “While all of the applications we received were certainly worthwhile causes,” says Joyce Gibson, Vice-Chair, “we are accountable to ensure our gifting remains in line with our mandates and eligibility requirements.” A special Gifting Committee of non-members was formed to review the applications and make recommendation to the Foundation Board. Considerable thought was taken to provide grants to a variety of different projects that enhance recreation, health, environment, education – just some of the key efforts the Foundation supports.

The Foundation is working to establish a long-term presence in the community and will be looking to host fundraising events in future to continue to build the endowment fund and support the work of the Foundation.
